How to enter

Your entry will be acknowledged by letter or email with further specific details relating to Show day.

Closing date for entry forms

No later than Wednesday 24th November 2011 Earlier please if at all possible.

Late entries will be accepted & displayed but may not be judged.

Entry Fee

The entry fee is \$3 per entry for all categories in each section. Pay your fee when you drop off your entry.

Delivery of items entered

Deliver your entries to the Lounge at The Hub for judging by 10.00 am on Sunday 20th November.

Judging – Awards and Certificates

Judging will take place from 10.30am to noon. Judges have expertise in the categories they are judging/have previously judged at shows. Judges can't enter the section they are judging. Certificates will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd winners in each category. A Champion in each section will be recognised with a unique rosette. Special certificates will be awarded at the judges' discretion.

Where is the Best of Feast Show? How will it look? Who can go?

The Show will have its own Venue in the Lounge at The Hub; you won't be able to miss it!

Entries will be displayed on trestle tables in their sections. All entries will be on show, arranged beautifully by the Best of Feast Show stewards.

Stewards will be on duty at the Show marquee to ensure the security of all entries on display. Entry to the Best of Feast Show is free.

Category A: Home Gardener

All vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor.

- 1 Asparagus – bunch of 6
- 2 Beans, plate
- 3 Beetroot, bunch of 4
- 4 Carrots, bunch of 4
- 5 Herbs, plate
- 6 Onions, bunch of 4, any variety
- 7 Rhubarb, bunch of 4

Category B: Organic Gardener

All vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor without the use of synthetic pesticides, herbicides or chemical fertilisers.

- 8 Asparagus – bunch of 6
- 9 Beans, plate
- 10 Beetroot, bunch of 4
- 11 Carrots, bunch of 4
- 12 Herbs, plate
- 13 Rhubarb, bunch of 4

Category C: Fruit

All fruit must be grown by the exhibitor.

- 14 Basket of mixed Fruit
- 15 Lemons, 4

Category D: Pot Plants

All pot plants must be grown by the exhibitor.

- 16 Bonsai
- 17 Cactus, one
- 18 Cactus, three different or same
- 19 Novelty pot
- 20 Succulent, one
- 21 Succulents, three different or same

Category F: Floral Art

Both professional and non-professional (mark entry form with P if professional). No artificial flowers permitted.

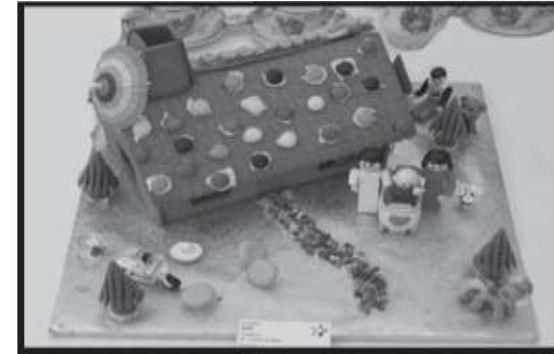

Category O: Special Category

All entries must have been prepared/made by the exhibitor.

Rules and Regulations

Delivery

All entries to be delivered to The Feast Hub in Light Square between 9.00am and 10.00am on Sunday 20th November. Stewards will be on hand to receive your entry. If your entry needs hanging, you need to supply the means to hang it.

Judging

The Judges decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

Security

Many entries are valuable. Feast will have Feast security staff at the Best of Feast Show at all times.

Damage

All reasonable care will be taken by best of Feast Show stewards. Feast will not be responsible for loss or damage that may occur to any entry, during or after the event.

Late Entries

Late entries may be accepted & displayed but may not be judged.

Display

No identification of entrants on entries until after judging. Exhibitors name cards will be placed with entries after judging by stewards.

Pick ups

Entries must be picked up 3.00pm-4.00pm on Sunday 20th November from The Feast Hub in Light Square.
